So that all parishioners may have equal access to desired dates and times for Masses, the following guidelines are followed:

- 1. Mass intentions with no particular date desired can be requested at any time.
- 2. Requests are on a first-come, first-served basis.
- 3. No more than 3 requests for the scheduling of particular dates per deceased and only 3 weekend Masses if more than 1 deceased is being remembered.
- 4. Mass intentions are not accepted for Christmas, Easter Triduum, Mother's Day and Father's Day.
