St. Mary's Choir is in great need of choristers and cantors. If you wish to dedicate your time and talent, please call Evelyn Kuter at 610-473-0203.

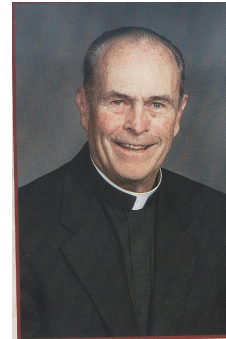
