SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Gn 22:1-2,9a, 10-13,15-18: Abraham and his son, Isaac, prefigure God, the Father, and Jesus, His divine Son. God tests Abraham's faith and because of it. God promises abundant blessings on the family of Abraham and all his descendants.

Rom 8:31b-34: God sent His Son into the world to die for us. Who is then going to judge God's chosen ones? Is this not the right of Jesus, who loves those for whom he gave His life?

Mk 9:2-10: Jesus becomes transfigured before Peter, James and John. God spoke, "This is My Son, My beloved. Listen to Him." Jesus asked His disciples to keep this a strict secret until He would be raised from the dead.

Today's Message - Abraham offers the ultimate sacrifice of thanksgiving, the gift of his very son. This sacrifice prefigures the sacrifice of Jesus who died for us all. In His transfiguration, Jesus discloses a suffering messiahship.
