

FIVE REASONS TO PRAY

If God knows what is in our hearts, why do we need to pray?

- 1. Prayer makes us aware that God wants what's best for us. "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are mine." (Isaiah 43:1)
- 2. Prayer helps us to put our worries into words. Speaking our worries help helps us see that things aren't as bad as we thought. "When cares increase within me, your comfort gives me joy." (Psalm 94:19)
- Prayer gives us something to do. Instead of being helpless, it's the first step we can take forward solving a problem. "I was helpless, but God saved me." (Psalm 116:6)
- 4. Prayer gives us courage. When we turn to God, we are strengthened. "God indeed is my savior; I am confident and unafraid." (Isaiah 12:2)
- 5. Prayer reminds us that we are not alone. Instead of feeling isolated, prayer reminds us that we are never alone. *"But I am not alone, because the Father is with me." (John 16:32)*
