The Church teaches that although some of the authorities of Christ's time bear responsibility for carrying out his execution, this charge must not be laid against all the Jewish people of Jesus' day or of our own. We are all responsible for sin and for our Lord's suffering.

<u>**1** Pt 1:17-21</u> - As followers of Jesus we have been ransomed by his blood. Through Him we are believers in God who raised Jesus from the dead. Our faith and hope is in Him.

<u>Lk 24:13-35</u> - Two disciples who do not recognize Jesus walk with him. Cleopas tells about Jesus—his miracles, passion, death and resurrection, and the hope Israel had in him. Finally, in the breaking of the bread they see that Jesus is with them, truly risen.

Today's Message - Through the blood of Jesus we have been delivered from the power of sin. We recognize him in the breaking of the bread, the one whom God raised from the dead and who now sits at his right hand forever.
