Memorial Plaques - From time to time, when someone dies the family suggests that, in lieu of flowers, donations be made to St. Catharine of Siena's Church Memorial Fund. When these donations amount to \$300 or more we put the name of the deceased on the plaque. These plaques are located in the vestibule of the Church and the Chapel.

We also memorialize those who have remembered St. Catharine's in their estates. These plaques are located in the Church. The various categories are: Willed Donations-Builders- \$1,000-\$4,999; Benefactors=\$5,000-\$19,000; Special Benefactors - \$20,000-\$49,000; Distinguished Benefactors - over \$50,000.

Bishop Alfred Schlert will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation on Thursday, October 15th at 4:30 p.m.

You still do not have to attend Mass in the current **Green Phase** if you feel uncomfortable, worried about crowds, ill, or at high risk, etc. The obligation to attend Mass at Church will remain suspended until further notice.

Masks still will be required, and social distancing will continue to be enforced. Parishes will continue to sanitize pews and other common surfaces after each Mass.

The new capacity limit means that parishes will be permitted to admit up to 50 percent of the Church's seating capacity, provided that adequate social distancing can be maintained.

The dispensation from the Mass obligation will remain in place for the time being, and many parishes will continue to offer livestream Masses on their websites or Facebook pages.

CHILDREN OFTEN TALK about what they want to be "when they grow up": doctors, lawyers, athletes, nurses, movie stars, teachers, carpenters. They may talk about these roles, but do they ever talk about being a priest, sister or brother? You are the hand of God—encourage your children to consider Church ministry.



Even though we are leaving the Church immediately after receiving Holy Communion, it is so very important in our spiritual lives for us to pause and recognize Christ's Eucharistic presence within us. Traditionally, the period after communion is a time of intense personal prayer for the believer. We invite you to take that time in your cars before leaving the Church parking lot. Below are two prayers that can be used, either individually, or they can be prayed aloud in a group or as a family: Prayers after communion:

Anima Christi Soul of Christ, sanctify me. Body of Christ, save me. Blood of Christ, inebriate me. Water from the side of Christ, wash me. Passion of Christ, strengthen me. O Good Jesus, hear me. Within Thy wounds hide me. Suffer me not to be separated from thee. From the malignant enemy defend me. In the hour of my death call me. And bid me come unto Thee, That with all Thy saints, I may praise thee Forever and ever. Amen.

What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart, that what is given to us in time, be our healing for eternity.

May Your Body, O Lord, which I have eaten, and Your Blood which I have drunk, cleave to my very soul, and grant that no trace of sin be found in me, whom these pure and holy mysteries have renewed. Who live and reign, world without end. Amen.

We humbly beseech You, almighty god, to grant that those whom You refresh with Your sacraments, may serve you worthily by a life well pleasing to You. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, Who lives and reigns, world without end. Amen.
