JUNE IS THE MONTH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

FRIDAY, June 11th is the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Promises made by the Lord to St. Margaret Mary are the reason for the Feast and First Friday devotions.

I will give them all the graces necessary to their state of life.

I will establish peace in their homes.

I will comfort them in their afflictions.

I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all in death.

I will bestow a large blessing upon all their undertakings. Sinners shall find in My heart the source and the infinite ocean of mercy.

Tepid souls shall grow fervent.

Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.

I will bless every place where a picture of My Heart shall be set up and honored.

I will give priests the gifts of touching the most hardened hearts.

Those who promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart never to be blotted out.

I promise thee in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will communicate on the First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final penitence; they shall not die in My disgrace nor without receiving their sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in the last moments.

Concerning our COVID-19 restrictions:

We urge all to use common sense in practicing distancing. Together with our Diocese, we continue to encourage all to receive communion in the hand as a hygienic measure during the pandemic. All those distributing communion will continue to take sanitary measures.

Sanitation: Please practice personal hygiene by sanitizing your hands. While the Church will not be sanitized after each Mass, we will be thoroughly cleaning the church 1-2 times per week.

Those who are fully vaccinated need no longer wear a mask. We trust that the unvaccinated will continue the practice of wearing a facial covering.

The Diocese of Allentown will continue to review our guidelines in the coming weeks.

MASS INTENTIONS

MONDAY, JUNE 7

Ex 24:3-8: The Israelites promised to observe all the prescriptions of the Lord as related by Moses. To seal this promise, Moses offered a sacrifice to the Lord and sprinkled the people with the blood offering.

Heb 9:11-15: Jesus came as high priest, not offering the blood of animals but His own blood, to achieve eternal redemption. Jesus is mediator of the new covenant.

Mk 14:12-16, 22-26: Jesus gave instructions for the Passsover supper. At this meal he took bread and wine and changed it into His Body and Blood and gave this Eucharist to His disciples. They all ate and drank at Jesus' request.

Today's Message: Moses ratifies the covenant by offering a thanksgiving sacrifice and by sprinkling blood over the people. The new covenant, the law's oblation, is ratified in the blood of Christ, the unblemished offering poured out for us.
