Since we will be purchasing product based on orders to limit our cost and to maintain fresh product, there will be very little to no availability for us to service walk-in patrons this year. Our apologies.

The Knights sincerely hope you understand as this was a difficult decision for us because it directly impacts our much appreciated loyal patrons to these events.




