



Catholic Trivia ANSWER: B. St. Kateri Tekakwitha was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on Oct. 21, 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans. Kateri was the first Native American Saint, was very devout and was known for her steadfast devotion. Sadly, just five years after her conversion to Catholicism, she became ill and passed away at age 24, on April 17, 1680. Her Feast day is July 14th. Her name, Katerina, is the Mohawk form of Catherine, which she took from St. Catherine of Siena.
