




Marriage and Family Life

<u>Catholic Trivia Answer D.</u> St. James was the son of Zebedee and Salome and brother of John the disciple. The title "the Greater" was added to St. James' name to help distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less," who is believed to have been shorter and younger than James "the Greater." Following Christ's Ascension, James spread the Gospel across Israel, the Roman kingdom, and Spain. He returned to Jerusalem but was martyred for his faith by King Herod, who decapitated him. Saint James the Greater is known as the first apostle to die. His remains were taken to Spain, by some of his followers. The El Camino ends in Santiago de Compostela, where the body of Saint James the Apostle rests. His Feast day is July 25th.
