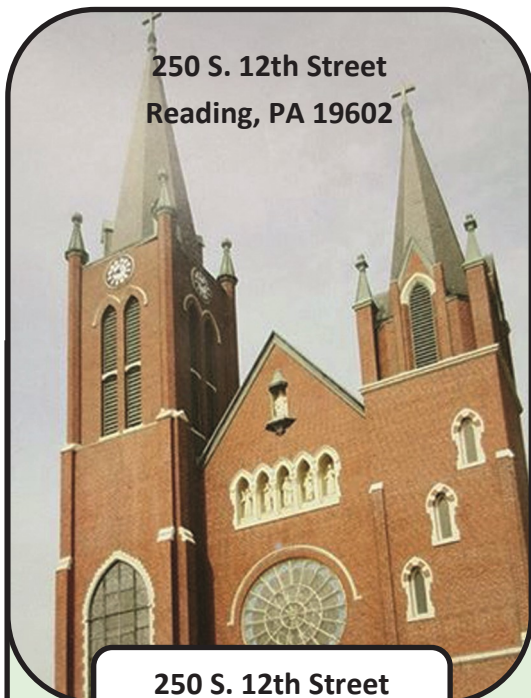

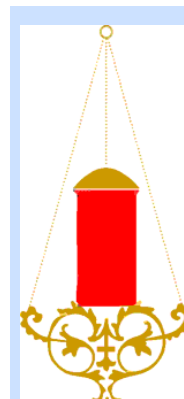

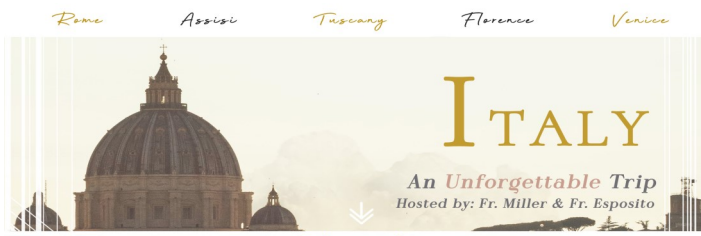

Catholic Trivia ANSWER: A. St. Ignatius Loyola is the patron saint of the Society of Jesus, soldiers, and educators. Ignatius passed away on July 31, 1556, at the age of 64. He was beatified by Pope Paul V on July 27, 1609 and canonized on March 12, 1622. His feast day is July 31. When he was a young man, he was a soldier for Spain, but after being seriously injured, he began studying while he recuperated. He earned a Master's Degree at the age of 44 and is well known for his Ignatian spiritual exercises.

Consider Scripture to read, learn to pray the Rosary, simply tell the Lord what's on your heart, take the time to listen and be silent.
