Family night - If you want to positively affect your family, set aside one night a week that your family spends together. Be consistent. It does not matter if your toddler is running around or your teenager is looking bored, just do it. Consider a regular formula to the evening. Of course, always begin and end in prayer (We are Catholic, that's what we do!) You can use this time to learn some traditional Catholic prayers that the children, or you, don't know by heart. Consider including an opening joke to promote joy and family fun, a values lesson to teach (If you don't teach them, society will), a roleplay to promote future good decision making, a spot light child to affirm, closing song and some kind of family treat to look forward to. Don't be afraid to vary the routine from time to time, or just go on an outing together in order to have fun. Listen to your kids for their input, but do not stop getting together as a family. This is what intentional parenting looks like.

Pro-tip: "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not depart from it" Proverbs 22:6

Challenge for the week: Look at the family calendar and mark what day and time will be your regular time to set side everything else in order to be together intentionally as a family. Start this week. Don't stop.
