

Anyone who is in good health, is 16 years of age or older, and weighs 110 pounds or more, may donate whole blood every 56 days. (16-year old donors require parental consent).

Did you know: 40% of the US population is eligible to donate – but only 5% do on a yearly basis.

Statistics show that 25% or more of us will require blood at least once in our

lifetime.

Every 2 seconds, someone in the US requires a blood transfusion.

It only takes about 45 minutes of your time to save a life.

Miller-Keystone Blood Center needs to see approximately 450 donors every day

to supply the 27 hospitals served by the blood center.



PURPOSE OF THE

BERKS COUNTY LIFE CHAIN

The Berks County LIFE CHAIN will provide a visual statement of solidarity by our local Christian community that abortion is grievously wrong and that the church Christ founded is opposed to the unmerciful killing of pre-born children. Please join with hundreds of Berks County Christians, representing 60+ churches standing on both sides of Penn Avenue, while holding 17" x 22" signs that read: Abortion Kills Children; Jesus Heals and Forgives; Adoption, the Loving Option; Lord, Forgive us and our Nation; Abortion Hurts Women; and Life, the First Inalienable Right. Our bold, prayful witness is scheduled from 2:00 to 3:30 PM, on Sunday, October 1, 2023; and we regard it as an extension of our regular worship on the Lord's Day. An estimated number of babies killed annually in Berks County exceeds 1,000; approximately 10-15 babies murdered weekly at Reading's Planned Parenthood facility. powerful LIFE CHAIN on October 1 will offer strong encouragement and hope for reducing that number. With your firm support, we are confident of having a strong chain, able to change the lives and minds of those who pass by. We have a comprehensive LIFE CHAIN manual to lead us each step of the way, but more importantly, we in the local Life ministry are experiencing peace with this project because we believe God has approved this event. Please join with us. Let us invest at least one hour to save a lifetime.

Catholic Trivia ANSWER: C. -On September 14th we honor or exalt the cross that Jesus was crucified on. In the 4th Century St. Helena, the mother of Constantine discovered the True Cross in Jerusalem. The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross commemorates two historic events. The first, the discovery in 320 AD of the True Cross, Calvary, and the tomb of Jesus and second, the dedication of the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on that site in 335 AD.

Marriage and Family Life - #9 Selflessness

In everything we watch, read or participate in it seems we are told by society, perhaps louder today than ever before, to put ourselves first, in a word, to be selfish. Shallow pleasures and immediate gratification seem to be glorified and prized above all else in the narcissistic culture. A principle like this may sound good for the individual on the surface, but it will destroy relationships both on a micro level, meaning the family, and a macro level, society. Selfishness is literally the opposite of Jesus's message and example of Love given for us. In Jesus we see that love is not an emotion, but rather a verb which is never selfish and always "Wills the Good of the other". The solution to the culture's message, is of course Christ's, and can be found lived out in many holy families. In these people delays of gratification and a reorientation to the "good of the other" help to foster trust, mutual respect, patience, kindness, joy, peace, and faithfulness in the home.

Pro tip: "As the family goes, so goes the nation, and so goes the whole world in which we live." - Saint Pope John Paul II.

Challenge for the week. Learn this acronym: F.A.M.I.L.Y, and what it stands for, "Forget About Me, I Love You!" Say it to yourself when tempted to be selfish against a family member or neighbor.
