Marriage and Family Life - Dedicate the day

It can seem sometimes like the world is moving a million miles an hour. As technology advances to make life "easier", it could be argued the opposite has occurred. It can feel like we have so many demands placed upon us that pop up each day that need to be addressed, immediately, of course. These demands happen at home, school, work and beyond. This is stressful on people and is certainly stressful on our most important Earthly relationship, the family.

Pro tip: Do not get out of bed without first dedicating the day to the Lord. Thank Him for a new day and give your troubles to Him in advance. Ask for His help.

Challenge: Set your alarm to go off 5 minutes earlier than typical. Use that time to talk to God, every morning. Consider increasing the time as you build your relationship with the Lord. Perhaps add a morning rosary walk with the dog each day or a few minutes reading the daily Mass readings. See how your day changes. It will be time well invested.

center.



Respecting All Life As A Gift From God

BERKS COUNTY LIFE CHAIN

The Berks County LIFE CHAIN will provide a visual statement of solidarity by our local Christian community, that abortion is grievously wrong and that the

community that abortion is grievously wrong and that the church Christ founded is opposed to the unmerciful killing of pre-born children. Please join with hundreds of Berks County Christians, representing 60+ churches standing on both sides of Penn Avenue, while holding 17" x 22" signs that read: Abortion Kills Children; Jesus Heals and Forgives; Adoption, the Loving Option; Lord, Forgive us and our Nation; Abortion Hurts Women; and Life, the First Inalienable Right. Our bold, prayful witness is scheduled from 2:00 to 3:30 PM, on Sunday, October 1, 2023; and we regard it as an extension of our regular worship on the Lord's Day. An estimated number of babies killed annually in Berks County exceeds 1,000; approximately 10-15 babies murdered weekly at Reading's Planned Parenthood facility. A powerful LIFE CHAIN on October 1 will offer strong encouragement and hope for reducing that number. With your firm support, we are confident of having a strong chain, able to change the lives and minds of those who pass by. We have a comprehensive LIFE CHAIN manual to lead us each step of the way, but more importantly, we in the local Life ministry are experiencing peace with this project because we believe God has approved this event. Please join with us. Let us invest at least one hour to save a lifetime.

Catholic Trivia ANSWER: D. -September 23rd if the feast day of St. Padre Pio. He became a Priest in Italy in 1910. While hearing confessions in 1915, he felt pain. He noticed the stigmata, the wounds of Christ, appearing on his hands and feet. The experience was painful and bleeding occurred. The wounds smelled of roses, and although they continued to weep, they never became infected. Doctors who later examined the stigmata were amazed at their perfectly round shape. In 1947, 27-year old Father Karol Józef Wojtyła (later <u>Pope John Paul II)</u> visited Pio, who heard his confession. Wojtyła confided that during this meeting, Pio told him he would one day ascend to "the highest post in the church," Padre Pio is known to advise, "Pray, hope and don't worry" and is known as the patron Saint for healing. The National Centre for Padre Pio is located in Barto, PA and includes a museum showing the history and relics of Saint Padre Pio. The Patron Saints of Italy are St. Francis of Assisi and St. Catharine of Siena.
