Catholic Trivia ANSWER: B.- Totus Tuus, a Latin phrase meaning "Totally Yours," was the motto of Pope Saint John Paul II. Taken from St. Louis de Montfort's True Devotion to Mary, it signifies our desire to give ourselves entirely to Jesus Christ through Mary. On October 16, 1978, Cardinal Karol Wojtyla, Archbishop of Krakow, was elected the 263rd successor to Saint Peter and chose the name John Paul II in honor of Pope John Paul I who had just died after only 33 days as Pope. His coat of arms included a Marian Cross. Pope John Paul II was the youngest pope in over a century. He was shot in an assassination attempt in St. Peter's Square in May 1981 and visited and forgave his shooter soon after. He attributed his survival to the protection of Mary. He convened the first World Youth Day in 1987; wrote many encyclicals during his twenty-six-year pontificate; and visited over 129 countries including the United States. He died on April 2, 2005, was beatified in 2011 by Pope Benedict XVI, and was canonized in 2014 by Pope Francis. Some of his most famous quotes include: "Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and hallelujah is our song."; "As the family goes, so goes the nation and so goes the whole world in which we live."; "Freedom consists not in doing what we like, but in having the right to do what we ought."; "It is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness; He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you"; and "God has assigned as a duty to every man the dignity of every woman."
