

<u>Mal 1:14b - 2:2b, 8-10</u>: I have sent a curse upon you, says the Lord, since you have turned from me. You have not kept my ways. Only one God has created us. Why do we break faith with one another?

<u>1 Thes</u> 2:7b-9: Paul tells the Thessalonians how he wanted to share the teachings of Jesus with them as well as his own life. He works day and night for them. The word of God works in those who believe.

Mt 23:1-12: Jesus warns that the Pharisees speak many words boldly, admonishing others to observe the Law but their deeds fail in fulfilling the Law. They act only to be seen. Only the humble will be exalted.

<u>Today's Message</u>: The prophet denounces those priests who in their pride have turned away from the Law, causing others to go astray. Jesus, too, is critical of those religious leaders who fail to practice what they preach. All, rather, are called to greatness through humility and service by sharing their lives with others.

<u>Kid Challenges</u> - Kids are so much fun but also, so much work. Every stage presents new challenges. When kids are little, they need help with everything. As they grow older, peers start to have major influences over their thinking. Older couples have seen the heartache of teen breakups and stayed up late worried about curfews and poor decisions. You may have little kids still. Enjoy this innocent stage, but remember that when you become a parent, you sign up for a lifetime of service. Don't shy away from the difficulty. Embrace the role God has given you to guide and shape a young life. (Family First 2023)

Pro-tip: "Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it." (Proverbs 22:6) Challenge of the week: Play "Questions" at the dinner table this

week. Everyone at the table gets a certain number of questions to ask (2 or 3). Parents ask kids and kids get to ask the parents. Some questions should be light hearted, some more thought provoking. Here is the catch, each person must be willing to answer every question you ask of another. For example, you ask the three-year-old, What's your favorite color and why. After she answers, you also answer your favorite color and why. Questions get more interesting as the kids get older. The "and why" is important to ask your child. Also important is your answer "and why" to the question as the parent. This game is sure to spark additional conversation and give you a better idea of how your children's moral compass is developing.
