Catholic Trivia ANSWER: B. Saint Cecelia was born in Rome and had taken a vow of virginity, but her parents insisted she marry a nobleman named Valerian. During the wedding, she sat apart singing to God in her heart. After the wedding, she told her husband that an angel was watching over her and he should leave her alone. When he asked to see the angel, she told him to first go be baptized by Pope Urban I. Following her advice, he got baptized and then saw the angel standing beside her, crowning her with roses and lilies. Although she died sometime between 222 and 235 AD, her body was found to still be incorrupt in 1599, seeming to be sleeping.
