Lk 2:22-40: Joseph and Mary take Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem to be presented to the Lord. Simeon recognizes Him as the Anointed of the Lord and blesses Him. The child returns to Nazareth and grows to maturity.

<u>Today's Message</u>: Family life is rooted in the unconditional love of God as witnessed by the Holy Family. Mindful of His covenant, God blesses the faith of Abraham and Sarah in their son, Isaac. The child Jesus and his parents are blessed by Simeon.



DID YOU KNOW? - Through the Pennsylvania Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) and the Pennsylvania Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC), businesses and individuals can lower their tax bills by donating to private schools, scholarship organizations, pre-K programs, and other educational enrichment initiatives. The bulk of the tax credits — \$110 million per year are reserved for donors that give to scholarship organizations, which provide financial aid to children attending K-12 private schools. The program also sets aside a small amount of tax credits for donors that give to pre-k scholarship funds. At Saint Catharine of Siena School, our EITC and OSTC program plays an essential role in the school's financial strategy as well as the fulfillment of our mission. Saint Catharine of Siena School is seeking donors to participate in the EITC/OSTC program to alleviate the burden of financial aid on our operating budget AND to give as many children access to a Catholic, Saint Catharine of Siena education as possible. At Christmas, the octave starts on the feast day, Christmas, and ends eight days later on New Year's Day. The Epiphany is celebrated on January 6th and marks the end of the 12 days of Christmas and the star leading the 3 Magi to visit the baby Jesus after His birth.
