

SCHOLARSHIPS - On Sunday, May 19, 2024, the Polish-American Board of Education of Berks County will be awarding \$25,000 in scholarships to Berks County high school seniors of Polish-American descent. Deadline for submitting the application form for this scholarship is Saturday April 20, 2024. In conjunction with the PABEBC scholarship awards program, the Polish-American Heritage Association of Berks County is awarding a \$2,500 project scholarship to a Berks County high school student of Polish-American descent. For this scholarship the student is required to submit a project on Polish history, culture, and/or traditions. Projects are due on Saturday, March 30, 2024. Applicants for the scholarships can obtain application forms and guidelines in the office of the Guidance Counselor in all Berks County high schools. 

Marriage and Family Reflections -Make Church Your Second Home- Home is defined as "the place where one lives permanently, especially as a member of a family or household". A happy home is even more. It is where we find others who love us unconditionally in spite of our shortcomings, a place to serve as we care for each other, a place to learn new skills & develop talents to share with family and then later to take into the world. It is the place we eat most of our meals, find rest and recharge. Home should be a happy place for us to be. Now think of church. We learn of Christ's saving doctrine at each Mass. We serve others and perform good works when we get involved in one of the many groups within the parish. We receive and share brotherly love at Mass and in the relationships formed there. In the Eucharist we find rest and recharge in order to bring Christ's love into the world.

Challenge of the week: Commit to participating in Mass regularly. Catholic Trivia ANSWER: A. Saint Hilary lived in France in the 3rd and 4th centuries and is the patron saint of children academically behind, children learning to walk, mothers, and the sick. He is invoked against rheumatism and snakebites. Hilary was elected Bishop of Poitiers in about 350. Hilary wrote a Latin commentary on the Gospel of Matthew as well as other Church writings defending the truth and condemning heresies such as those that denied the divinity of Christ. He is considered by some as the first Latin Christian hymn writer. St Augustine of Hippo called him "the illustrious doctor of the churches" and he was formally recognized as a Doctor of the Church in 1851 by Pope Pius IX.
