

Catholic Trivia ANSWER: C. - Thomas Aquinas is known at the "Angelic Doctor" with the title doctor meaning teacher. He was a prolific writer, including producing the liturgy for the newly created feast of Corpus Christi for Pope Urban IV. He also wrote hymns, some of which are still sung today, such as Pange Lingua whose final two verses are the famous Tantum Ergo. In 1265 Pope Clement IV summoned him to Rome to serve as papal theologian. While there, he completed his most famous work, the Summa Theologiae. It is traditionally held that Thomas was seen at a convent in Naples levitating in prayer before an icon of the crucified Christ and that Christ said to Thomas, "You have written well of me, Thomas. What reward would you have for your labor?" And that Thomas replied, "Nothing but you, Lord." He was canonized by Pope John XXIII in 1323. At the Council of Trent in the 1500's, his Summa Theologiae was placed on the altar alongside the Bible.
