

Please call Dave Gibney at [484.332.1624](tel:484.332.1624), or schedule online at <https://donor.giveapint.org/donor/schedules/drive-schedule/85668>. Anyone who is in good health, is 16 years of age or older, and weighs 110 pounds or more, may donate whole blood every 56 days. (16-year old donors require parental consent).

Did you know: 40% of the US population is eligible to donate – but only 5% do on a yearly basis.

Statistics show that 25% or more of us will require blood at least once in our lifetime.

Every 2 seconds, someone in the US requires a blood transfusion. It only takes about 45 minutes of your time to save a life.

Miller-Keystone Blood Center needs to see approximately 450 donors every day to supply the 27 hospitals served by the blood center.

Catholic Trivia ANSWER: B. - Ash Wednesday is 6 ½ weeks before Easter. Since the date of Easter changes and is determined as the Sunday after the first full moon of the vernal equinox, Ash Wednesday can be between February 4th and March 11th. In 2024, Ash Wednesday is on February 14th. Catholics fast on Ash Wednesday, abstain from eating meat, and receive ashes on their forehead in the shape of a cross as a remembrance of their human mortality and need for reconciliation with God. When putting ashes on the foreheads, the Priest usually says “Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return” or “Repent and believe in the Bible.” Lent as a 40 day period of fasting and prayer began at the First Council of Nicea in 325 AD.
