



<u>Catholic Trivia ANSWER: C.</u> - Saint Katharine Drexel was born into a wealthy family. Her father was a banker, and sadly, her mother died 5 weeks after her birth. She was raised by her devout father who prayed for 30 minutes every night and by her step-mother who opened their home to care for the poor. Katharine was touched by the poverty she saw when she traveled, and she became a religious Sister and an educator to help them. She dedicated her life to helping Native Americans and African Americans. In 1915, she founded Xavier University in New Orleans, the first Catholic University for African Americans. She is the 2nd American born Saint and was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2000.
