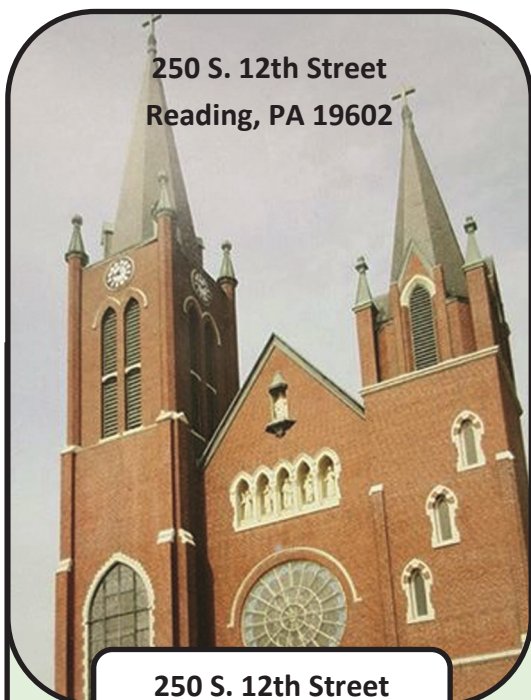

Catholic Trivia ANSWER: B.—St. Patrick was born in Britain in about 389. He was captured by pirates and taken to Ireland when he was about 16. He worked there as a shepherd and learned about Irish culture. After six years as a slave, he escaped by boat and went home. He studied the faith in Italy and France and after being ordained, he was sent to Ireland as a missionary where he baptized thousands. Since he understood their traditions, he was skilled at explaining Christianity in a way that made sense to the Irish people. He often used imagery as Jesus did. One example is showing them a shamrock to explain the Trinity. Additional symbols associated with Saint Patrick are a shamrock, harp, demons and a serpent, even though the legend of St. Patrick banishing snakes from Ireland is likely false because post-glacial Ireland is not known to have had snakes. The other symbols are associated with: A: St. Paul; C: St. Peter; and D: St. Catharine of Siena.

We Are Remembered 33rd Easter Mass
