On March 29th, 2024 at 9:15 PM, Pope Francis is scheduled to celebrate the Stations of the Cross also known as the Way of the Cross or the Via Crusis at the Colosseum. In 1751,

Franciscan missionary Leonardo da Porto Mauorizio received permission from Pope Benedict XIV to organize the Via Crusis at the Colosseum. Fourteen stations were built there and the Via Crusis was regularly held there for about 100 years. In 1959, St. John XXIII restored the Via Crusis in the Colosseum and successive Popes have publicly prayed it there on Good Friday. After two years of being celebrated in a reduced form in St. Peter's Square due to the pandemic, Pope Francis resumed the Good Friday event being in the Colosseum in 2022. The Stations of the Cross with Pope Francis may be available live via radio and television if you'd like to participate.
