



Catholic Trivia ANSWER: C. - Jesus, I trust in You. Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter based on the private revelations of Jesus to St. Faustina Kowalska in the 1930's. When Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina in 2000, he instituted "Divine Mercy Sunday." The Divine Mercy image shows Christ in a white garment with red and pale rays coming from His heart representing blood and water. In her diary, St. Faustina wrote

that Jesus asked her to create this image of Him to be venerated in her chapel and then throughout the world. Jesus promised her that the soul who venerates this image will not perish. Jesus, we trust in You!
