

Catholic Trivia ANSWER: B. On May 13, 1917, in Fatima, Portugal, three shepherd children, Lucia and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta reported seeing "a Lady more brilliant than the Sun." Mary appeared to the children six times that year, gave them prophesies, told them to pray the Rosary every day to bring Peace to the world and an end to war, and said she would perform a miracle so everyone may believe. On October 13, 1917 huge crowds gathered and reported seeing what is known as the Miracle of the Sun, where the Sun spun, danced and zig zagged towards Earth before returning to its normal position. Mary, as Our Lady of Fatima, is celebrated on May 13th.
